

Water's Journey takes you to the Taita Hills in Kenya, to cool streams percolating from lush mist forests of mountain tops, to forest fires raging on cleared slopes, and to corn drying under the blazing sun in the dry lowland. The film witnesses the eternal cycle of water and the change of seasons in a region confronting the ever increasing effects of climate change.

Keyla is a teenager who lives in Providencia, a small island in the Colombian Caribbean inhabited by a community of Africans, Spaniards, and English pirates. One day his father goes fishing, but he doesn't return. While looking for him, Keyla receives an unexpected visit: the father's ex-wife comes from Spain with her half-brother, and the girl is forced to receive them. This is the story of a broken family reunited by the disappearance of one of its members.

After a prosecution lawyer is framed and convicted for murder, he tries to catch the real murderer from jail with the help of a con artist.
