

Guide for Authors

We are accepting articles in the areas of (i) Technology as a Driver of Economic Growth; and (ii) Artificial Intelligence as an emerging trend in IT. Authors are required to upload their manuscripts using the link on the website for consideration before the submission deadline. Manuscripts should be written in English, a word count of approximately 5,000 words (or between 10-15 pages long), Times New Roman, font size 12, single-spacing, and in PDF Format. The paper outline should include: Introduction, Literature Review, Methodology, Solution Design/Framework, Evaluation, and Conclusion.

Selected papers will be published in the Journal of Language, Technology & Entrepreneurship (JOLTE) in Africa which is a peer-reviewed cross-disciplinary journal that is published by the United States International University-Africa. If your paper is selected for the Journal publication by the team of peer reviewers, the editor will request you and your fellow authors to provide your bio-blurb. Authors are strongly advised to follow the conventions below to avoid early rejection.

Provide references immediately after the text: Sort authors' names alphabetically using surnames and add postscripts (a, b, c, etc.) to the date of publication if the author has more than 2 books in the same year, e.g. Onyango (2009c). Titles of articles and books should only capitalize the first word, the rest of the title in lower case. Italicize titles of articles and books: Examples: Leech, Geoffrey (1983) *Principles of pragmatics*. London/New York: Longman or Labov, William (1972a) *Language in the inner city: Studies in the Black Vernacular Philadelphia*: University of Pennsylvania Press. Labov, William (1972b) *Sociolinguistic patterns*. Philadelphia: University of Pennsylvania Press. Culpepper, Jonathan (1996). *Towards an anatomy of impoliteness*. *Journal of Pragmatics* 25.3:349- 367.

Use footnotes (after text) or endnotes (before the references section) to make your work more legible. Use Arabic numerals for the footnotes and endnotes. Use double quotation marks for short quotes but place longer quotes in an indented paragraph separate from main text body with a single space. All illustrations (tables, figures, etc.) should be integrated in the text. Provide plain text without coloring of letters or background, word-processing etc. The article will be type-set by the editors.
