

USIU-Africa hosts Evidence to Action Conference

USIU-Africa through the School of Graduate Studies, Research & Extension hosted the first Africa Monitoring and Evaluation conference -Evidence to Action, themed "Bridging the Gap: Strengthening the connections between Research, Evaluation and Evidence-based Policies and Practices in Sub-Saharan Africa" from Thursday July 26 to Friday July 27.

The two day conference which was held in partnership with International Centre for Evaluation and Development (ICED), the Monitoring and Evaluation Department, the National Treasury and Ministry of Planning among other institutions, brought together over 400 participants including top government officials, researchers, institutions of higher learning, embassies and agencies from across the globe.

The conference provided a platform for participants to discuss issues surrounding credible research and relevant evidence to inform policies and decision-making processes, as well as discuss the importance of monitoring and evaluation.

Present at the opening ceremony on Thursday, July 26 at the auditorium, the Treasury Cabinet Secretary (CS) Mr. Henry Rotich said that the government has set aside at least Sh6 billion aimed at enhancing transparency in government operations and hold those in charge accountable for taxpayer money through monitoring and evaluation. Additionally, the CS said that this will strengthen efficiency in utilization of resources and timely realisation of results leading to speedy development in the country.

The Chancellor Dr. Manu Chandaria, in his welcoming remarks said that it is important for institutions and organizations to make policy based on evidence adding that anything without evidence does not work. He further said that through evidence, the process of policy making will be efficient.

Concurring with the Chancellor, the Vice Chancellor Prof. Paul Zeleza pointed out that the university recognizes the importance of making decisions based on research evidence. He said that through the School of Graduate Studies, Research & Extension, the university is able to increase research capacity,

monitor and evaluate and contribute to the research agenda both internally and externally.

Dr. David Amweyaw, Chief Executive Officer -ICED, said that the conference will bridge the gap between the researchers, the evaluators and policy makers hence the theme of the conference. He further said that the conference aims at increasing policy relevance, demand driven research and the adoption of evidence into policy making decision.

Also present at the event was Dr. Julius Muia, Principal Secretary for Planning, The National Treasury and Planning, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu, Kenya National Assembly, Hon. Dr. Anthony Akoto Osei, Cabinet

Minister, The Ministry of Monitoring and Evaluation, Ghana.

Other partners in the organization of the conference included; Institute of Statistical, Social and Economic Research, University of Ghana Feed the Future Innovation Labs for Assets and Market Access, University of California Davis (AMA Basis), Agricultural Technology Adoption Initiative (ATAI), Tegemo Institute of Agricultural Policy and Development (Egerton University), African Institute for Development Policy (AFIDEP) and Campbell Collaboration.

Prof. Paul Zeleza scoops a prestigious award

The Vice Chancellor Prof. Paul Zeleza has yet again bagged a prestigious award “The Thabo Mbeki Award for Leadership”, which was conferred to him by the Board of Toyin Falola Annual International Conference (TOFAC), the Board of Pan-African University Press and the Ibadan Cultural Group, University of Ibadan in July this year.

The Thabo Mbeki Award for Leadership honors an African of a high caliber with unblemished record of public service or in the private sector, committed to the project of African Renaissance and African Unity and who has distinguished him/herself in the public or private sector.

This award adds to the many accolades the Vice Chancellor has received including Africa’s most prestigious book prize, the Noma Award, for his books; *A Modern Economic History of Africa (1993)* and *Manufacturing African Studies and Crises (1997)*, Choice Outstanding Academic Title (2003) and Honorable Mention, Conover-Porter Award (2004).

Prof. Zeleza has made a measurable impact through his research and academic work in intellectual history, African studies, gender studies, diaspora studies, human rights and African literature that has crossed traditional boundaries.

His impact as Vice-Chancellor includes the infrastructural expansion of USIU-Africa, the building of a Research Park and medical hospital, extensive linkages with programs in the United States, a green environment, and the involvement of students in the day-to-day management of the campus.

School of Pharmacy holds inaugural breakfast meeting

On Friday, July 20, the School of Pharmacy and Health Science hosted its staff, faculty and students for an inaugural breakfast meeting in LT4, to discuss the current state of the school, new developments and provide a platform for staff, students and faculty to interact.

The breakfast was also held to celebrate the leadership of the former program director Dr. Betty Mbatia, Assistant Professor of Biochemistry & Biotechnology and welcome Dr. Lincoln Munyendo the Inaugural Chair, Department of Industrial and Analytical Pharmacy.

Prof. Njeri Wamae, Dean, School of Pharmacy and Health Science, pointed out that apart from launching the new program, B.Sc. in Epidemiology and Biostatistics, the school plans to introduce two other innovative programs; B. Tech Analytical Chemistry and B.Sc. in Applied Biochemistry in the next academic year.

Moreover, Prof. Wamae further said that the school is working to introduce B.Sc. Medical Laboratory Sciences and B.Sc. Nursing in the near future, adding that as the school expands, new innovative market driven health science programs will also be introduced.

The Dean pointed out that the Mentor/Mentee initiative where students are matched with faculty to ensure that all students get professional attention from faculty has been successfully completed with each member of faculty being allocated 17 students to mentor.

Prof. Wamae applauded the school for the great research work and publishing and encouraged participants to take part in research activities. She also pointed out that the Kenyan Government is gradually supporting high quality research since it has commitment 2% (amounts to 45-60 Billion KSH) of the country's GDP towards research, as indicated in the Science Technology and Innovation Act (2013). Prof. Wamae further said that the government established the National Research Fund (NRF) body to manage the

research fund where some members of faculty and staff from the school have been awarded research grants.

Prof. Wamae said that in the 2018/2019 academic year, the school plans to hire new faculty and staff, purchase state of the art equipment, construct Animal House to house and care for laboratory animals and continue

with the renovations in the Pharmacy Skills Laboratory.

The incoming chair, Dr. Lincon Munyendo said that he is grateful for his appointment and added that he will work together with faculty, staff and students to grow the school in accordance to the University's strategic plan.
