USIU-Africa has built a vibrant community life for academic excellence since its inception in 1969. Students, faculty and staff mingle and interact in an atmosphere that inspires inquiry, dialogue and personal development. To enhance and sustain an even better environment on-campus accommodation is an imperative.

The challenge

USIU-Africa faces the key challenge of providing student hostels. Currently on-campus student accommodation consists of only two 128-bed capacity hostels hosting 256 students, representing 3.7% of the student population. The rest reside in difficult conditions all over the city.

Our plan

As part of our 2015-2020 strategic plan we want to build on-campus hostels to accommodate 25% of the students by 2020. Eventually, we want to provide accommodation to all our students.

We are currently engaging like-minded partners to construct 2500 bed-capacity hostels initially to host all freshmen and all international students.

Envisioned impact

Accommodating students in on-campus hostels will:

- i. Raise the student's academic achievement as they will focus better away from distractions
- ii. Guarantee safety and security away from the very difficult conditions in the city
- iii. Improve contact hours since the classes will just be a door step away.
- iv. Improve retention and graduation rates. This will lead to students graduating on time in readiness to live and work anywhere in the world, creating national and global impact.
- v. Improve the USIU-Africa brand and attract many students to benefit from the global quality of education.
